The Eagles defeated four straight ranked teams, topping No. 13 Illinois Central and No. 16 Cowley on Friday and knocking off No. 19 Johnson County and No. 14 McHenry County on Saturday.

Kirkwood climbed from No. 8 in the nation to No. 4 after that performance and Madsy Richards was duly honored as the national player of the week.

"We want to continue to grow, we want to continue to get better, we want to improve on some of the silly mistakes that we've had," said Williams. "We need to minimize those, and on some nights eliminate those."

Kirkwood has dropped only three sets during its 13-match winning streak and has not lost a match since Aug. 27.
