The Saints have won nine of their last 11 games after a rugged start, but they'll need all the confidence they can muster in the 3A playoffs.



Xavier collected a methodical victory over Clinton Monday with a 12-hit attack and solid pitching from Adam Tvedt and Sam Meyers. Tvedt struck out eight batters and allowed three runs in five innings for the victory, then Meyers tossed two scoreless frames to finish the game.

Jake Guckenberger, on a hot streak lately, went 3-for-4 for the Saints. Gabe Lux, batting in the No. 9 spot in the order, was 2-for-2 with a walk, two runs and two RBIs.
