

Hembera wins Metro Spotlight Award

Cedar Valley Christian junior Shelby Hembera is the winner of the Metro Spotlight Award for high school girls this week, the Metro Sports Report announced Sunday.

Hembera is averaging 31.5 points and 15.3 rebounds for the girls basketball team after four games. She ranks third in the state in all classes in scoring and is tied for first in rebounding.

Hembera, a 6-footer, averaged 16 points and 8.6 rebounds as a freshman. She averaged 22 points and 9.9 rebounds as a sophomore and made all-state in Class 1A.

Hembera scored 34 points and grabbed 24 rebounds in a game last week. She also plays volleyball for the Huskies.
